It is now just into the middle of the calendar year and I trust we are all finding some pleasure and relaxation in the natural beauty of the season. Maybe life has a more relaxed pace and it is easier to find time to ponder and assess, or perhaps just the opposite--summer activities make life seem more hectic. Wherever we are with our time demands, I suggest we earmark some moments to consider the Bible story of the widow's mite.

This story is told in Mark 12: 41-44 and Luke 21 1-4. It is one of the many, many, many parables where Jesus mentions money since a mite is a small coin (like a penny) used in Biblical times. I'd traditionally heard a message of

faithful giving as it relates to our money in this story. I think that message is still there but nowadays I've added another dimension to my focus.

Our stewardship messages always reference giving Time, Talent and Treasure. It is **TIME** that I suggest we consider in a careful and honest way.

Time is a gift each of us can give.

Any one of us can check in with a fellow parishioner and have an exchange that goes beyond the weather and the latest ballgame. Anyone of us can make a call to someone we haven't seen in person for a while and catch up. Anyone of us can sign up (perhaps with another person) to host coffee hour and brew the coffee, provide a modest snack and clean-up afterwards. Any one of us can volunteer at the cookie booth, tag sale, bake or craft for the fair, or become an usher. Any one of us can join the Bible study group or book discussion group and practice experiencing Jesus with the joy and clarity our church school kids express to us in their recap on Sunday mornings.

Any of these actions uses our time in the manner as Jesus urged us to behave loving one another. I think it is unlikely that we will ever feel we have a surplus of time. Personally and as a parish, our spiritual growth will stem from giving out of our relative poverty. The widow did it, we can do it. Jesus notices!

Their current needs, according to their website, are: instant rice or potatoes, Hamburger Helper, mayonnaise, pancake mix, syrup, canned soups, baked beans, spaghetti sauce, cooking oil, Chef Boyardee pasta meals, tea, and canned vegetables. Please check any expiration or best by dates as, despite the fact that the food may still be perfectly edible, the Food Ban is prohibited from giving it to their clients.
